"You are wise, Joseph," said Pharaoh, "and I place this land in your care." He gave Joseph a ring, and people bowed down to him.




The Commandments

The Lord wrote his Commandments on two stone tablets and gave them to Moses to carry down to the people.




The Child Jesus in the Temple
