# Jericho Is Conquered by God's People

AFTER the death of Moses, God told Joshua to lead the people into Canaan, for He had given the whole land to them. He also showed him how to conquer the important city of Jericho.

## Jesus Gives Us the Eucharist

TESUS knew that He would soon be put to death. So He told the Apostles to meet Him in a certain room for His Last Supper with them.

Jesus took some bread, and when He had said the blessing, He broke it and gave it to the Apostles. "Take this . . . and eat of it," He said, "for this is My Body."

Then He took a cup, and when He had given thanks He gave it to them. "Take this, all of you, and drink from it," He said, "for this is the chalice of My Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in memory of Me."

Jesus gave His Apostles His greatest Gift—His own Body and Blood under the appearances of bread and wine. He made the Apostles priests and gave them the power to do the same thing in memory of Him.
