Lead by example

REFLECTION. Educators have identified multiple learning styles—visual, auditory, and tactile learning are but a few. Research has found that those who learn through example and a "hands on" approach retain more information.

PRAYER. Jesus, speak to me in Your Word that I may learn from You.

REFLECTION. Sometimes it seems that no good deed goes unpunished. We try to please our parents or teachers and somehow it comes back to hurt us. Jesus, too, experienced opposition when He healed people and spoke of God.

Opposition never stopped Jesus from speaking the truth or doing good and it shouldn't stop us either.

PRAYER. Lord God, never allow the negative voices of others to discourage me from following Your example.
